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~~inflammation 1. The inflammatory phase begins once the skin (and sometimes underlying tissues) is injured and continues for about 24 hours. The major characteristics of the inflammatory phase are skin color changes, heat, swelling, pain, and loss of function. This immune system reaction to an injury protects the body from infection and expedites healing.~~

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~~Apply oxygen at 2 L/min via nasal cannula. -Following an acute injury, the body responds by increasing perfusion to the location of the injry during the inflammatory phase of wound healing. The purpose of this increased blood supply to the wounds is to transport the oxygen and nutrients essential for healing.~~

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Surrounding wound edges can become macerated because of the moisture contained in the dressing, and that can lead to enlargement of the wound's diameter. Cross-contamination is also an issue as the saturated gauze in wet-to-dry dressings does not provide any barrier to the environment, thus allowing organisms in and out of the wound easily.
