Slavery (17th and 18th Century) Slavery began in the United States in the early 17th century and continued through the 18th century. The first Africans (about 20 people) were brought to the North American Colony of Jamestown by a Dutch ship in August of 1619 (History

Channel). These early Europeans who settled here in America turned to African slaves as a cheaper, more plentiful labor source than indentured servants (who were mostly poorer Europeans) (History Channel).

During the 17th and 18th centuries, African and African American (those born in the New World) slaves worked mainly on the tobacco, rice, and indigo plantations of the Southern seaboard. Eventually slavery became rooted in the South's huge cotton and sugar plantations. Although Northern businessmen made great fortunes from the trade of enslaved peoples and from investments in Southern plantations, slavery was never widespread in the North.
