The international community is increasingly aware of and responsive to the impact of armed conflict on women and girls (as shown, for instance, by the unanimous adoption in October 2001 of United Nations Security Council Resolution 1325, which included the special needs of women and girls during repatriation and resettlement, rehabilitation, reintegration and post-conflict reconstruction) and the importance of their participation in peace processes and the post-conflict period.

Forty-three provisions of the Geneva Conventions and protocols specifically deal with women and the effect of armed conflict.

PROTECTION OF WOMEN IN SITUATIONS OF ARMED CONFLICT—AN

International humanitarian law grants women general protection as civilian persons, and required that women members of the armed forces shall in all cases benefit from treatment as favourable as that granted to men. the rule that women deprived of liberty, i.e. civilian internees or prisoners of war, must be confined in separate quarters from male internees and must be under the immediate supervision of women.
